

YOUR CONSULTATION SUPPORT CARD

Erection problems (EPs) - when a man cannot get or sustain an erection long enough for sexual intercourse - are estimated to affect 6 million men in the UK.¹ Men can access effective treatment from pharmacy. As well as being able to make a difference to someone's quality of life and relationships, there is also an opportunity to have a wider conversation about men's health and give appropriate lifestyle advice.

EPs can be caused by many factors, including physical causes, psychological causes and lifestyle factors. Sildenafil is a phosphodiesterase type-5 (PDE5) inhibitor. It works by blocking the action of PDE5, which helps to relax and widen the blood vessels, improving the flow of blood to the penis.

For men aged 18 years and over

Dose:

One to be taken around an hour before sexual activity. Maximum once daily dosage

Key advice

Advice to give when making a supply:

- See GP within 6 months of first use
- Needs sexual stimulation to work
- Avoid taking after a high fat meal; don't take with grapefruit/grapefruit juice
- Avoid drinking excess alcohol as that can impair the ability to have an erection
- Relevant lifestyle advice e.g. maintaining a healthy weight and diet; reducing stress; taking exercise; stopping smoking, and avoiding recreational drugs.

Consultation tips

- •The VIAGRA CONNECT Pharmacy Checklist can be used to help give structure to consultations and identify where there may be contraindications for use, e.g. use of nitrates. Remember to offer the privacy of the consultation room.
- VIAGRA CONNECT should **not** be used by men who are not fit enough for sexual activity (e.g. recent stroke). Using the questions on the checklist can help to identify this.

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- Common side-effects include: headache; flushing; nausea; indigestion and nasal congestion. Sometimes patients may be affected by dizziness or visual changes; if this occurs they should not drive until reactions have returned to normal. Loss of vision, priapism or chest pains need medical attention urgently.²
- If the product is not effective initially, the patient can be advised that it can take a few attempts to work. However, if they have tried on eight separate occasions, advise them that they can see their GP or access an appropriate online ED clinic in order to discuss alternative options.
